

His primary and high school experiences were in Nyanga, one of the 8 mission stations established by Congo Inland Mission, and he was baptized there at the age of 11. He left Nyanga for Congo's capital city, Kinshasa, where he studied theology, eventually receiving a doctorate from the Congo Protestant University after research in Brussels. After his first wife passed away, he married Marcelline Mbalo. Pastor Komuesa has worked as a religion teacher, pastor, district pastoral supervisor, and university theology professor, all for Mennonite Church of Congo. In 2004 he was elected national President of the church, and is currently serving his second mandate in that role.
- Rod Hollinger-Janzen: Rod spent 17 years in West Africa- 14 with Mennonite Mission Network and 3 with Mennonite Central Committee. He has been in his executive coordinator role at AIMM now for 10 years. He is married to Lynda, and they have 3 adult children.
- Zion Mennonite Church, Elbing, KS; Ray Reimer and Rosie Epp, pastors.
