Thank you!... to all from Zion who served at New Hope Shelter this last week, helping members of our communities who are in need. During our week of volunteering, 9 new residents entered the shelter, 4 residents moved into their own housing, and 3 residents left for unknown locations. 11 residents were already employed, 1 gained employment, 3 were on disability. New Hope served 11 single men and 6 single women and 3 family units consisting of 3 moms and 1 father and 5 children—and also dispensed 11 food boxes to people from the community in need. Together with First Menn. Ch. (Newton), we provided 7 evening meals, evening volunteers for 7 nights and overnight volunteers for 2 nights, totaling 124 hours of service.
