### *Congregational Announcements*

**Supporting area food banks** through December: Most of us just enjoyed a good Thanksgiving meal (even if it may not have had all the usual festivities); let’s not overlook those struggling to get by, without enough to eat. Local food pantries note they’ve been heavily utilized this year, and their shelves are often sparse. We’ve recently had an offering for Harvest of Love (Newton), with another coming up soon for the pantries in Peabody and Whitewater (with similar focus as part of our Christmas Eve offering), but consider buying extra staples, and dropping them by church for us to pass on. Preferred items: canned goods, mac & cheese, cereal, spaghetti noodles/sauce, peanut butter/jelly, hamburger/tuna helper. Remember—nothing expired!

**Holiday season greens** have been placed at the Zion cemetery for those who requested such; thanks to Lois Friesen for organizing this!

*Anabaptist World* has had a challenging year; in addition to all else, they’ve had to merge two subscriber databases. Thus, some (especially those previously receiving *Mennonite World Review*) may be receiving subscription notices in the mail. If you’re on the Zion group subscription plan you may safely ignore these.

Dec. 20, 6-8 P.M.: With not being together Christmas Eve this year we are putting together Zion **Christmas Cheer Trips** on the date/time noted. We have designated greeters/carolers who will be delivering Christmas Cheer Bags to everyone in the congregation (in the Elbing-Peabody-Whitewater-Newton area) on this evening. The greeters/carolers may sing you a Christmas carol, read you a verse or poem, or simply wish you a Merry Christmas while remaining outside of your home. *Please* do not ask them to come into your home, ask for a hug/handshake, or give them any treats. We want to keep everyone safe, maintain 6 feet of distance, and wear masks. We trust this will be a welcome opportunity for fellowship within our church; thanks to June Entz for doing much of the organizing, Steph Entz for arranging a photo card of Zion’s children to share with our seniors, and Lois Friesen for coordinating peppernut baking!

Dec. 24: The **Zion Christmas Eve service** this year will be pre-recorded and available for you to watch at your convenience on Christmas Eve (*a link will be circulated a day or two ahead*). Many families and individuals from Zion have cooperated to put this service of scripture and music together. In preparation you may want to get a hymnal so you can sing along with the carols, and candles to light with the singing of “Peace, Peace” at the close. The offering will be split between Mennonite Central Committee and local food banks; donations may be sent to the church, dropped off, or made via our online donation tool. Contact one of the pastors if you need access to a device for viewing the service.

Jan. 3, 2021: Our Epiphany worship on this date will include (virtual) **communion**; members are encouraged to prepare, both by searching themselves spiritually, and gathering elements (bread and juice/wine).

Zion is eligible to have two **delegates at the upcoming MC USA assembly** (July 7-10, 2021; in Cincinnati, OH); plans are still underway, but the anticipation is that attendance could be either in-person or virtual. At least one of the pastors is willing to be a delegate. If other members of the congregation have interest, *please indicate that to Becky Nickel*, congregational secretary, prior to our upcoming congregational meeting on Jan. 6, so that delegates might be affirmed.

Jan. 6, 7 P.M.: Zion's **Congregational meeting** for reports and projects is scheduled for this date / time, again via Zoom; those without internet access are encouraged to contact Pastor Ray regarding options for participation. Agenda is anticipated to include: review of 2020 reports (including auditors' report), report from the "space exploration committee," process for review and / or renewal of call vote on interim pastoral team, affirmation of Zion delegates to MC USA assembly in summer 2021, discussion of Elda Hiebert estate gift and surplus in the local fund. The Zoom link and associated resources (including 2020 report book) will be circulated about 10 days ahead of the meeting.

Jan. 9: With appropriate precautions in place, **Kara Klingenberg's Dominican Republic medical mission trip** is scheduled to begin on the date noted. No surgery this year—only medical and dental care in villages. COVID rates are very low in the region, with strict laws like masks and curfews. Donations are appreciated to serve patients including toothbrushes, hair bows, new flip flops, first aid supplies, unwanted medical equipment, small toys like cars, baseballs, reusable masks, etc. Monetary donations will be used to purchase medications. Donations can be left by the Zion mailboxes or mailed to Kara. Thank you!

Jan. 13, 7:30 P.M.: **Wednesday evening adult Bible study** resumes, focusing on Paul's epistle to the Romans. Sermons through the winter / early spring will have similar focus, with sequential passages—so plan to participate in both for the full experience! A Zoom link will be circulated closer to the date.
